Public Education Funding

Tom Wolf will **restore state support of public schools and higher education**, reversing Governor Corbett's \$1 billion cuts.

Tom Wolf will **protect collective bargaining rights** and defined benefit pension plans. He supports raising the state minimum wage to \$10.10.
